Reflective Thoughts

Dear Village Community,

Currently, The Village Community Church is studying and exploring the book of Acts. Acts 2:14–36 transcribes the first sermon ever given by a Christian, Peter. There are about 900,000 visiting Jews in Jerusalem from as far away as Rome, Alexandria, and Mesopotamia. A crowd of them have just heard a group of Galileans speaking in their native dialects. The question floating around the crowd is "What does this mean?" Peter is more than happy to explain.

In the following verses, Peter reminds the crowd of Joel's prophecy that we will be given the tremendous promise that God will visit His people by his Spirit. We don't know much about Joel except that he was a prophet in Judah around 835 to 800 BC. The prophecies in his book cover events immediate to his time, including the devastation wrought by a horde of locusts, but also the beginning vears of the church and the end times.

But this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 'And it shall come to pass in the last days, says God, That I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your young men shall see visions, Your old men shall dream dreams. And on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days; And they shall prophesy. (Acts 2:16-18)
